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Welcome to the Trident Schools Community

We are delighted to welcome you and your family to Trident Schools. This guide has been prepared specifically for families relocating to North-Western Zambia as FQM employees, to help you navigate the schooling options available and feel confident and informed as you prepare your child's educational journey.

Trident Schools are the leading group of international schools in North-Western Zambia, established to provide internationally benchmarked education for both local and expatriate families. The school group consists of three preparatory schools (one in Solwezi, one in Kalumbila, and one in Lusaka) and one secondary school, offering continuous education from early years through to A-Level and university entry.

Trident Prep Kalumbila is conveniently located within the Trident Woodlands Estate, making the daily school run straightforward for most families. Older children from Kalumbila who move to secondary education at Trident College in Solwezi typically board during the week or term.

Academic Pathway and Curriculum

Trident Schools offer the internationally recognised Cambridge curriculum from Early Years through to A-Level (AS and A2), making it straightforward for globally mobile families to join and later transition to international schools and tertiary education elsewhere in the world.

Cambridge Primary (Trident Prep Solwezi and Trident Prep Kalumbila)

Both preparatory schools run a dual curriculum combining Cambridge Primary and the International Primary Curriculum (IPC). Cambridge Primary is taught across three core subjects — English, Mathematics and Science — with an emphasis on critical thinking, problem-solving and independent learning. All pupils sit Cambridge Primary Checkpoints at the end of Year 6.

The IPC complements Cambridge Primary through the humanities, arts, sciences and technology, providing themed, cross-subject units that encourage creativity and independent inquiry.



Cambridge Secondary and Sixth Form (Trident College)

Trident College follows the Cambridge Lower Secondary and IGCSE pathway in Years 7–11, progressing to AS-Level and A-Level in Years 12 and 13. This provides strong preparation for university applications worldwide, including the UK, South Africa, and international universities.

The Trident vision is to **unlock the potential within each child, as we prepare them to take on the mantle of global citizenship in a dynamic and changing world.**

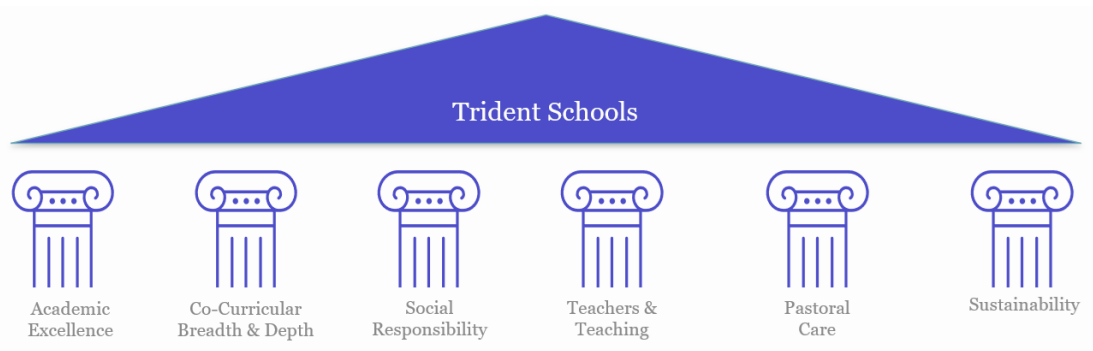
Our mission is to **support students in developing critical thinking and problem solving skills through meaningful relationships and a caring, child-centred education delivered by teachers from around the world.**

Education at Trident schools is supported on six foundational pillars. Each of these pillars bears equal weight in supporting a strong institution with constant focus on the individual child.



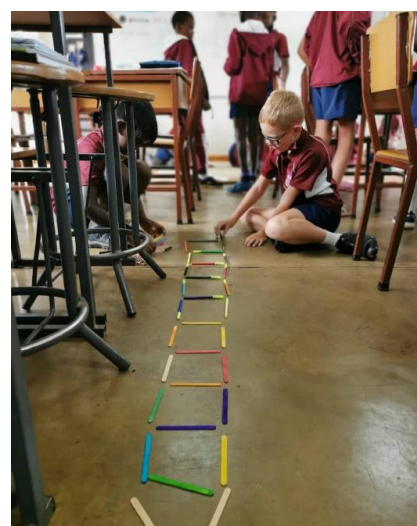


Academic Excellence

The School Day

Trident Prep Schools

At the prep schools, **students arrive from 07:00 each morning, with lessons beginning at 07:20.** Where possible, students are encouraged to cycle or walk to school.

The academic timetable runs to around 13:00 each day, depending on which year your child is in (children in the lower year groups may finish a little earlier).

Years 1-6 engage in afternoon CCAs (co-curricular activities) after lunch every day except Friday. **Pick up is 14:30 Monday to Thursday, and 13:00 on Friday.** Younger year groups may have less CCA days.

Children need to come to school with a healthy pack lunch and a water bottle. At TPK, prepaid lunches can be ordered through the TWE Club — contact the admin office for details.





Trident College (Boarding and Day)

The school day for Years 7–13 runs from 07:00 to 16:15, with co-curricular activities from 14:00 to 16:00 Monday to Thursday. Boarding students follow an evening routine including house meetings, supervised prep/study time, and structured bedtimes. The dining hall opens from 05:45 for breakfast.

Boarding at Trident College

For Kalumbila-based families with children at secondary level (Years 7–13), boarding at Trident College provides a safe, structured, and genuinely caring environment. Trident College is located on the Kansanshi Mine Estate in Solwezi, on a huge and beautiful game reserve campus that is unique among international schools.

Boarding at Trident is a place to develop character, independence, and lifelong friendships in one of the most distinctive school settings in Africa.



The Four Boarding Houses

Each boarding house is named after an FQM mine — a nod to the founding partnership between Trident Schools and First Quantum Minerals. Your child will be allocated to one of the four houses:

Boarding Staff and Pastoral Care

Each house is led by an experienced Housemaster or Housemistress who lives on campus adjacent to the boarding house. They are supported by an Assistant Housemaster/Housemistress, a Resident Tutor, a Matron, and a team of Academic Tutors who supervise evening prep. A school nurse is available on a rotational basis and can be reached at nurse@trident-college.com (tel: 0962555361).

Boarding House Life

Junior boarding (Kansanshi and Las Cruces houses) accommodates two to four students per cubicle, giving younger boarders company and a sense of belonging. Year 10 students have single rooms. Senior students



in Years 12 and 13 typically share with a friend, with a small number of single rooms available to house leaders. Day scholars have Cobre House as their own central hub, where they can socialise and collaborate with their friends and peers during their breaks.

The daily boarding routine includes:

- Breakfast from 05:45 in the dining hall
- House meeting and roll call each evening
- Supervised prep/study time from 18:45 (junior houses) and 19:00 (senior houses)
- Structured bedtimes with house lock-up at 21:30
- Weekend activities, including Saturday sports sessions, evening movies, and access to the on-campus game park

Transport for Kalumbila Boarding Families

Transport is provided for Kalumbila boarding families at weekends and beginning and end of terms. A school bus departs Kalumbila for Trident College each term/weekend. The first and last weekends of each term are usually denoted as closed weekends, where boarders are expected to stay in. Each house uses these weekends to develop house spirit through special activities. Boarding families should confirm the current schedule with the admissions team as timings may vary by term. On Fridays, there are no afternoon CCAs, and boarding students can usually be collected for home weekends unless they have been selected to represent the College in cultural or sporting competitions.

Pastoral Care, Wellbeing and Learning Support

The wellbeing of each student is central to school life at Trident. Each child's first point of contact is their class teacher, who knows them well and provides daily pastoral support.

Safeguarding

Each school has a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) responsible for all matters relating to student safety — physical, emotional, and psychological, and a deputy DSL. The Safeguarding Leads are commonly the Head of School or the Deputy Head Pastoral; your school will tell you who is the current DSL. The Safeguarding Policy can be found on the school website.

In the case of any emergency, the school will contact parents immediately and provide appropriate medical care. The College has a dedicated nurse (0962555361) available on a rotational basis.

Learning Support

All three schools have dedicated in-house Learning Support Coordinators. Support is available for students across the full ability range — those working towards expectations and those who consistently exceed them. Specialist assessments are available through local and international Educational Psychologists, always in partnership with parents. You can read the full [Trident Learning Support Policy here](#).

Transition Support for New Students

Trident Schools are experienced in welcoming families from many different countries and school systems. New students benefit from:

School Uniform

All compulsory uniform items are available from the school office. Personal items must match the current school uniform accurately.

Hair must be neatly presented. Long hair should be tied back. Boys' hair should be above the collar. Nail varnish and jewellery (beyond a watch, medical bangle, and plain stud earrings for girls) are not permitted.

The school tracksuit may be worn over uniform in cold weather, with the shirt collar visible. One-piece swimming costumes and swimming caps are required for all swim sessions.

Trident College Uniform List

Pupils are expected to be neatly dressed at all times, and to wear their uniform with pride. All clothing items below are available in the uniform shop at the College. The shop is open for a week before the start of the January term, during the first week of each term and then once per week during term time. If you are arriving mid-term, the school administrators will help you get equipped.

As far as possible, all items should be clearly named. Purchases of uniform items by the student must be authorised by their parent by email to the school office, so they can be added to their bill.





Pupils are permitted to wear their own clothes from the end of formal school at 16:15, after the Co-Curricular Activities programme.

On weekends, formal lessons end at 13:00, after which pupils may change into their own clothes.

Please note that on certain occasions, pupils may be required to remain in full school uniform for formal evening events or Saturday morning activities.

Stationery

Basic stationery is shared within classrooms, but parents are encouraged to provide a personal set for each child. A suggested stationery list includes, at the prep schools:

Boarders may also like to bring thumb tacks, and a PIN code safe for valuables is recommended.

Co-Curricular Activities

Education at Trident schools extends well beyond the classroom. All schools offer a broad range of co-curricular activities (CCAs) that develop confidence, resilience, teamwork, and leadership.

Sport

Sport is a core part of the Trident experience. As well as regular CCA activities after school and PE lessons, students compete in inter-house and inter-school competitions throughout the year. Sports on offer across the Trident group include:

Cultural Clubs and Activities

The prep schools offer a varied programme of cultural clubs running throughout the year, including Art, Music and Drama, Wildlife Warriors, STEM, Coding, Debate, Outreach, Chess, Gardening and Cooking. Trident College offers a range of musical, dramatic and artistic clubs, clubs for playing games, clubs geared towards nature, the environment and sustainability, and spiritual community clubs. Boarders also enjoy a weekend activity programme.



Outdoor Education



At Trident, outdoor education is an important part of the child and young person's experience all through their school life. We have designed our own outdoor education curriculum to support and extend those skills that are more difficult to practice in a traditional classroom; skills like leadership, confidence, resilience, teamwork and compromise.

Trident Prep Kalumbila is proud of its own outdoor education centre, visited by all the schools, where children can practice taking risks, overcoming challenges and working together in the beautiful miombo woodland behind the school. As the children grow, they enjoy increasingly challenging camps, building up from a sleepover in school in the younger years to short overnight camps, culminating in Year 6 when pupils travel to the Ndubaluba Outdoor Centre in Mkushi for a more challenging expedition.

At the College, each year group goes on a camp where they practice skills in more depth, culminating in a deeply impactful service expedition to Meheba refugee camp. This programme is complemented by an extremely active Duke of Edinburgh programme, through which students can gain their gold medals if they persevere. These camps are highlights of the school year and widely celebrated by students and families alike.

How Schools Communicate with Parents

Trident Prep Solwezi

The school uses ClassDojo as its primary weekly communication tool — download the free app to receive timetable updates, event information, and assembly notifications. Formal communications (letters from the Head, financial statements) are sent by email. Trident College

The College communicates via email for formal matters and through house staff for boarding queries. Contact the relevant Housemaster/Housemistress directly for boarding pastoral matters.

Parent-Teacher Communication



Class teachers are always your first point of contact. The formal communication structure for escalating communication is as follows:

Class Teacher → Head Teacher → Executive Head of Trident Schools → CEO of Educare Services

Teachers hold Orientation Meetings at the start of the year and Parent-Teacher Meetings at the end of each term to discuss your child's progress.

Parent Engagement — Get Involved

Trident schools actively welcome parent involvement. There are several ways to participate:

- Parent Committee (PC) — a formal committee that works alongside the Head Teacher on operational matters. PC members serve two-year terms and meet at least once per term.
- Parent Teacher Association (PTA) — coordinates fun and fundraising events, with funds used for school resources. Open to all parents.
- Class Representatives — parents who coordinate communication and activities for their class. Volunteering as a class rep is a great way to meet the community.
- Volunteer for field trips, sports events, CCA clubs and classroom interactions.



Admissions Process

To secure a place for your child, we strongly recommend beginning the admissions process as early as possible — particularly for boarding placements and key entry points in Year 7, Year 10 and Year 12.

The first and most important step in enrolling your child is to make contact with the Head of their respective school, who will be delighted to talk you through the admissions process, hear about your child's interests and background, and explain more about the school and what to expect.

3. Submit supporting documents:
 - a. Previous school reports (last two years)
 - b. Birth certificate
 - c. Child's passport / National ID
 - d. Parent / guardian passport or ID
 - e. Financial clearance letter from previous school
 - f. Two recent passport-size photographs
 - g. Assessment or placement review (where applicable)
4. Meeting with the relevant Head Teacher (recommended)
5. Confirm acceptance, pay Application Fee and Registration Deposit, and sign Terms and Conditions



Do not hesitate to get in touch with school admin should you have any trouble with the admissions process.

School Fees and FQM Support

FQM Employee Fee Arrangement

- FQM provides 50% fee remission toward school fees for eligible employees.
- The remaining 50% is payable by the parent.
- For FQM employees, school fees are deducted a month in advance via FQM payroll.

Important Fee Information

- A 5% discount applies for full payment of annual fees by the 6th January each year.
- Term payment deadlines for 2026 are as follows:
 - **Term 1 — 6th January**
 - **Term 2 — 29th April**
 - **Term 3 — 7th August**
- Payment plans are available; requests must be made by 6th December.
- A 5% sibling discount applies for the third and subsequent children enrolled simultaneously (not applicable to FQM payroll deductions).
- A full term's written notice is required when withdrawing a child.
- Pro-rated fees apply for mid-term enrolments.

2026 Fee Structure

All fees are published in USD but must be paid in Zambian Kwacha (ZMW) at the prevailing Bank of Zambia exchange rate on the date of payment.
